Craig Dykers is an American architect and Founding Partner of the architecture firm Snøhetta. Dykers has led many of Snøhetta's prominent projects internationally, including the Alexandria Library in Egypt, the Norwegian National Opera and Ballet in Oslo, Norway, the National September 11 Memorial Museum Pavilion in New York City, and the recently completed Ryerson University Student Learning Centre in Toronto, Ontario, Canada. Dykers is currently leading the design of the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art Expansion in San Francisco, the new Times Square Reconstruction in New York City, both of which are currently under construction, as well as the Calgary Public Library, in Alberta, Canada.

Founding Principal, Gustafson Guthrie Nichol, Seattle and Washington DC*

Kathryn Gustafson brings over 30 years of distinguished practice to her partnerships in two offices, Gustafson Guthrie Nichol in Seattle and Gustafson Porter in London. Her diverse works are known as ground-breaking, contemporary designs that incorporate the sculptural, sensual qualities that are fundamental to the human experience of landscape. Kathryn's completed work from both firms includes the Smithsonian's National Museum of African American History and Culture in Washington, DC, Cultuurpark Westergasfabriek in Amsterdam, Seattle City Hall Plaza, Robert and Arlene Kogod Courtyard at the Smithsonian American Art Museum and National Portrait Gallery in Washington, DC, and the Diana, Princess of Wales Memorial Fountain in London. Kathryn's current projects include Bay East, Gardens by the Bay in Singapore, Valencia's Parque Central, and the Civic Park at Hemisfair in San Antonio, TX.

Jinhee Park received a Master in Architecture from the Harvard Graduate School of Design and a B.F.A. in Industrial Design from Seoul National University. Her work at SsD has been celebrated through numerous awards including a 2015 Best in Competition Award from AIANY, a 2012 Architecture Vanguard from Architectural Record, the 2009 AIA Young Architects Award, and the 2007 Young Architects Forum Award from the Architectural League of New York. Jinhee is currently Adjunct Professor at Columbia GSAPP and from 2009-13 she has served as Design Critic in Architecture at the Harvard GSD. Previous appointments include Distinguished Visiting Professor at the Bernard and Anne Spitzer School of Architecture CCNY in 2014, the Morgenstern Chair Professor at the Illinois Institute of Technology in 2008, and the Sasaki Distinguished Visiting Critic at the Boston Architectural College in 2007.

Florian Idenburg is Founding Partner of SO - IL and Associate Professor in Practice of Architecture at Harvard's Graduate School of Design. The firm consistently strives for progressive architecture beyond the cultural and economic constraints facing the discipline. It is this optimistic position that guides SO - IL's various experiments in a range of media from temporary installations to large-scale built works. Prior to founding SO - IL, Idenburg gained experience at the practice of Pritzker laureates Kazuyo Sejima + Ryue Nishizawa (SANAA), where he led the design teams for the Glass Pavilion in Toledo, Ohio and The New Museum of Contemporary Art in New York City. Idenburg is the 2010 recipient of the Charlotte Kohler Prize, an award from the Prince Bernhard Royal Cultural Fund in the Netherlands for exceptional talent, and a 2014 finalist for the Prix de Rome.

Vo Trong Nghia studied architecture at the University of Tokyo before returning to Vietnam to establish Vo Trong Nghia Architects in 2006. Through a series of award-winning projects, Nghia has developed sustainable architectural design by integrating inexpensive, local materials and traditional skills with contemporary aesthetics and modern methodologies. Nghia has received numerous international prizes and honours including but not limited to: a World Architecture Festival Award, an ARCASIA award, a WAN 21 for 21 Award, and a FuturArc Green Leadership Award. In 2012, he was selected as the Architect of the Year in Vietnam. Besides running his architectural practice, Nghia has continued to be involved in architecture at a grass-roots level by teaching at the Nagoya Institute of Technology in 2011. Nghia is a registered architect in Vietnam.
